A ceremony held on 3 May 2015, at the HBKU Student Center, marked HBKU's second graduating class and introduced 122 new graduates into the community of HBKU alumni, whose members are shaping the future of Qatar and the region.

Outstanding achievers are recognized

GRADUATES whose educational experience at Qatar Foundation (QF) saw them demonstrate both academic excellence and outstanding service have been recognized by Hamad bin Khalifa University (HBKU).

The five winners of HBKU's 2015 President's Award, who all graduated from QF member universities this year, were presented with certificates of achievement and commemorative medallions by Dr Ahmad Hasnah, President of HBKU, and Dr Khalid Al Khanji, Vice President, Student Affairs, HBKU, at a ceremony held on 30 April 2015 that was attended by university deans, faculty, and staff, as well as students' families and

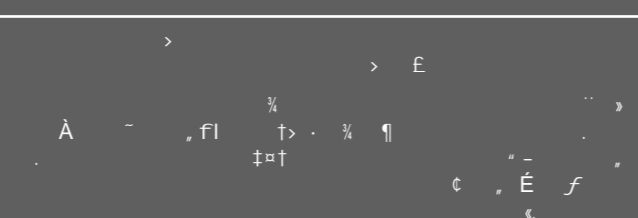
HEBA HOSNY, whose daughter, Mennatallah, graduated as a Doctor of Medicine, Weill Cornell Medical College in Qatar

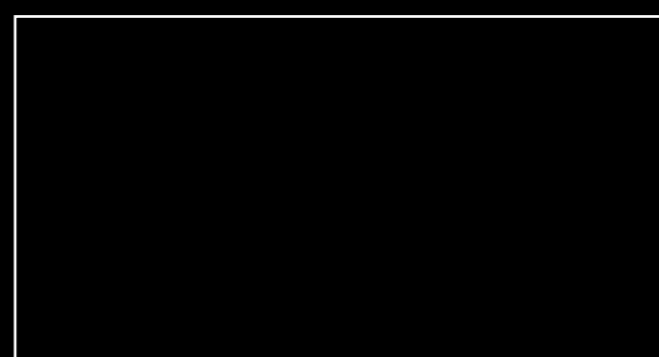
WAAD AL KHENJI, whose brother, Abdulla, graduated as a Bachelor of Science in Information Systems, Carnegie Mellon University in Qatar

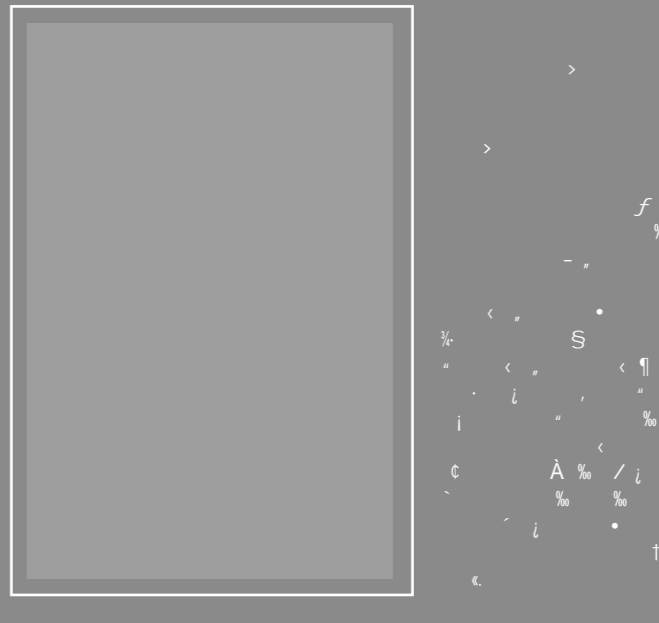
OSAMA EL NAMLA, whose brother, Ahmad, graduated with an Executive MBA, HEC Paris
